Sports Personality of the Month (2) - Brian Denness

To ensure that he was in a totally relaxed state for organising our event at Stanton Moor, Brian jetted off for a week's holiday in Istanbul returning home in time for a quick trip to the equipment store on the Friday before an evening out at the Ritz in Belper. It seemed to work as the event went pretty well.

Stanton Moor – a Request

Derek & I were the planners. It was only our third planning experience and we're aware we still have a lot to learn, which is where the request comes in. We need your feedback to understand where we could do better. For instance, we've never done a brown course and are never likely to now, so, we abide by the guidelines, but how do we tell what the typical brown runner would prefer. I tend to obsessively avoid sending brown round a small area twice if I can because I'd hate it. And I tend to assume what is grindingly slow going though heather for me is much less of a problem to most brown runners (I've been overtaken many times by young fit runners gliding over what I'm picking my way cautiously through), but maybe I'm wrong, and when the choice is 2 or 3 "runs" cross heather or twice round an area, the former is preferable. Only brown runners can tell me.

We still have grandchildren so feel we have a reasonable understanding of white and yellow, but did we get it right? And some planners have little experience of children and won't know when they're getting it wrong unless you tell them.

At least brown, white and yellow are likely to have a single kind of clientele; some of the other courses have more complex requirements. Light green is a good example, it tends to be thought of as the stepping stone from orange to green, but it's also the way down from green and maybe even blue for older runners who cannot do the distances any longer. So perhaps some are happy to tackle the physical, but want it to be significantly less technical than green, while the others want a shorter les physical course with almost the same technical difficulty as the green. How well did we meet the 2 extremes?

So, this is a plea for constructive criticism – and some positive comments would be nice, otherwise we may be too discouraged to do it again – so that we can get better. We did solicit some comments on the day and there have been one or two emails, but more would be good – you'll get better courses by telling your planners what you enjoyed and what you didn't. District Orienteering Event

Riber Hillside

Sunday 29th April 2007

By car: Parking at John Smedley Mill in Lea Bridge (SK318563). From the A6 at Cromford crossroads (3km south of Matlock) follow Mill Road/Lea Road for 3km.

By public transport: Bus services between Matlock and Alfreton (services 140 and 237) stop adjacent to the event car park at John Smedley Mill in Lea Bridge. Train or bus services to Cromford - 3km from the event - are available from Nottingham, Derby, Chesterfield, Buxton, Ashbourne.

Cost: Seniors £7 (reduced to £5 for National and East Midlands members of British Orienteering); Juniors/Students £1; Family £15 (reduced to £11 for National and East Midlands members of British Orienteering). Please show your membership card. On White, Yellow and Orange courses, family groups running together pay only one Senior entry fee.

The event will use SportIdent electronic punching. If you do not have a SportIdent card, you can hire one at Registration. Hire fee of 50p for Seniors, free for Juniors.

<u>Registration</u> open 10 - 12. Registration, Toilets, Finish and Download will be in the north car park. From the south car park, cross the road and walk 300m along a track.

<u>Starts</u> from 1030 - 1230. Starts times will not be allocated. There will be two starts. White, Yellow, Orange and Light Green courses will use the **Near Start**, which is 25m from the South car park and 325m from the North car park. Green, Blue and Brown courses will use the **Far Start**, which is approximately 2km along roads, allow 20 - 25 minutes. Clothing bags will be provided at the Far Start and returned to the North car park.

Courses: String, White, Yellow, Orange, Light Green, Green, Blue, Brown

Maps: 10:000, A4 size, updated 2006. Maps will be pre-marked but not be bagged.

<u>Terrain</u>: Steep woodland with open areas, areas of contour detail, many line features. Little undergrowth but can be slippery. Courses have significant climb

Whistles must be carried. Competitors take part at their own risk
